Clark D. Manus, FAIA

2011 President, The American Institute of Architects

Clark Manus is CEO of San Francisco-based Heller Manus Architects and China-based Heller Manus International. In his role as architect and urban design principal, Clark's 30-year career has greatly influenced the character of San Francisco's built environment. His experience encompasses a wide range of major new and reconstruction projects including residential, commercial, civic, rehabilitation / adaptive re-use, performance and retail facilities, as well as city planning studies for the San Francisco Bay Area, several U.S. cities, and two of China's largest cities, Shanghai and Guangzhou. Clark is widely recognized for his expertise in the design and delivery of complex, mixed-use projects, especially in difficult approval environments.

Paul Tange

President, Tange Associates

Paul Noritaka Tange, President of Tange Associates. Paul graduated from Harvard in 1985. That same year he joined Kenzo Tange Associates, the architectural firm headed by his father, well known international architect, Kenzo Tange. Paul became President of Kenzo Tange Associates in 1997 and founded Tange Associates in 2003. Tange Associates, headquartered in Tokyo, Japan, has worked worldwide and offers a full range of architectural and urban design and planning services. At this time, Tange Associates has close to 40 on-going projects in ten countries. The firm's extensive international experience enables it to work effectively in all cultures. Its long standing associations with local architectural firms and its familiarity with local building practices is invaluable to Tange Associates' ability to efficiently undertake small to large scale projects in urban as well as rural areas in all parts of the world. Paul himself exemplifies the international element of his practice. Born in Tokyo, Japan, and educated in Japan, Switzerland and the US, he is a registered architect of both Japan and Singapore.

Academically, Paul has also served as an Assistant Professor of Architecture at the University of Hong Kong and has reviewed at the Architecture Association and the Bartlett School of Architecture in London.

Dr. Peter Cookson Smith is an architect, planner, urban designer and Honorary Member of the AIA Hong Kong. Peter is also currently Vice-President of the Hong Kong Institute of Urban Design.
