

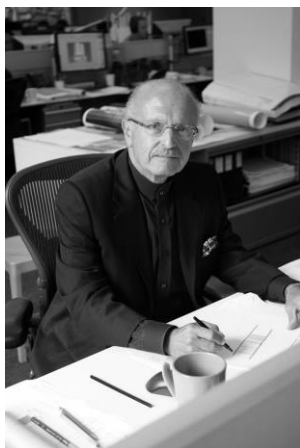

Ng is currently the President of the Hong Kong Institute of Architects. He has served on numerous government advisory committees including the Harbourfront Enhancement Committee and the Steering Committee of Urban Renewal Strategy Review. He was appointed a member of Harbourfront Commission in 2010, and was appointed Chairman of the Core Group on Public Engagement of the Harbour Commission in 2013, responsible for conducting the Public Engagement Exercise for the Proposed Establishment of a Harbourfront Authority. He is a founding member and was Vice-President (Local Policies) of the Hong Kong Institute of Urban Design from 2010-2014.

After studying at the AA and practising in London, Nasrine Seraji moved to Paris in 1989 to establish her studio, where architecture is treated as both a cultural debate and a practice. She has lectured and exhibited her work widely in Europe and North America, as well as in China and South East Asia.

Seraji has completed apartment buildings in Vienna, student housing in Paris and an extension to the School of Architecture in Lille. She continues to participate in competitions of varying types and complexities, ranging from urban design master plans and institutional buildings to small houses and installations, and in May 2016 she was honoured with the title “*Officer*” in the National order of Merit in France.
